President's Message | Round Lake

Hello fellow Round Lake residents-

I hope you all enjoyed the summer on the lake as much as we did, and you are taking in the beautiful fall weather we are experiencing. It is 62 degrees as I am writing this on October 20th looking out our window at the fall colors on full display.

We've had a couple of changes to our board this past year. Dan Lee resigned his position on the board, opening a position for Sue Donovan to join. Linda Esser, after serving for over 15 years as the Treasurer for both the Round Lake Improvement Association "RLIA" and Round Lake Improvement District "RLID" along with being the Newsletter coordinator is handing off some of her duties. Sue Donovan agreed to take on the role of RLIA Treasurer and Phyllis Trcka will be the Newsletter coordinator. Linda Esser will retain the Treasurer role for RLID. Thanks to Sue and Phyllis for stepping into their new roles and a special thank you to Linda for her years of service and agreeing to continue in the RLID Treasurer role.

I think we can all agree that after a disruptive summer of road work on County Road 115 AKA Ojibwa Road, the results were worth the inconvenience and it is now a better and safer experience to travel. The county and the construction companies did a good job keeping us informed. Also due to the weather cooperating, they were able to complete an additional piece of the road reconstruction project from Sugar Bush Creek to East Lake Hubert Drive. Next spring, they will begin the final phase of the road reconstruction project for Nash-way Road from 371 to East Lake Hubert Drive.

The association has some other additional notes to wrap up with. The lake levels remained normal this summer allowing Bishops Creek to be easily navigable. Also, we contracted Lakes Restoration to test for curly leaf pondweed early this spring. Two years ago, they detected and treated 6.5 acres of growth. Fortunately, where they tested the treated area this spring, they found no substantial growth. Therefore, no treatment was required.

Navigation Markers

Just as there are signs and markers along roadways for auto traffic, there are also signs along our waterways, such as buoys, markers and lights. For boaters, a few simple rules go a long way. When it comes to identifying the safest route, markers and buoys are used to identify the location of the channel.

Perhaps most important are the hazard markers; indicating areas to avoid. Next are the red and green channel markers. Per Minnesota regulations, the red buoy or marker is to be situated on the right side of the channel when heading towards shore, or when heading upstream. But, from a practical standpoint to lake boaters, the key is to stay between the red and green buoys that mark the channel.

1. Investigate the causes for excess vegetation in the lake. This includes focusing on the north side of Merrifield Bay, the Ditch 13 incoming water, wake boat impacts, etc. As causes are identified, plans will be made and implemented to reduce vegetation.
2. Maintain water quality. This is an educational goal to share knowledge with all the landowners and continue to investigate

potential sources of pollution and solutions to reduce them.

3. Work with and foster relations with outside agencies that directly impact life on our lake.
4. Continue monitoring AIS and establish an AIS emergency response team and action plans ready to implement immediately in the event newly found AIS are identified in our lake.
5. Increase the walleye fish population in North Long Lake in an effort to provide a positive walleye fishing experience for members.

We've made good progress on several of these goals and most of these goals will carry over from year to year. We'll update you on progress toward these goals at our annual meeting in July.

Looking forward now, I still have some gear in the water to be removed before the snow flies, and that will happen soon enough. When the snow does come, let's hope for a nice constant snowfall throughout the winter, with no big, wet, and heavy snow like we had last December. We just want enough to be able to enjoy our lake life recreation opportunities like snowshoeing, skiing, skating, snowmobiling, and maybe some ice fishing. A good snowpack will help us enjoy all four seasons and get us started toward higher water levels going forward.

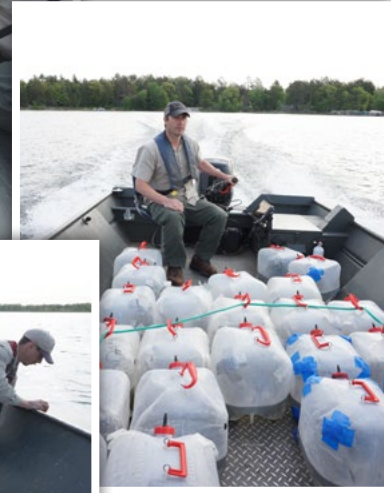
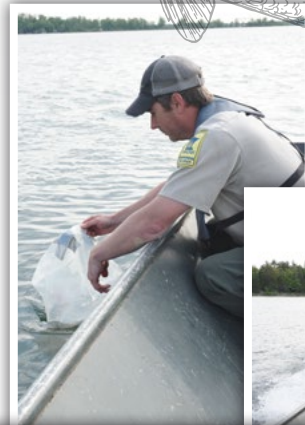


North Long Lake Walleye Stocking

As pointed out in the article in our Spring edition, North Long Lake is not natural fishery for walleye. Virtually all of the walleye in our lake is stocked, either as fry (tiny) or fingerlings (small). Last year (2022), there were approximately 4 million fry and 36,000 fingerlings stocked, according to the DNR. This year, to date, approximately 4 million fry were stock (fingerlings may be stocked this fall).

These come from the DNR hatchery in Pine River. There, walleye are trapped during spawning season and the eggs are extracted from females and the milt from males.

Here are some photos from the hatchery and of the fry being stocked in North Long Lake. The DNR is in the process of collecting walleye fingerlings for stocking. We will update you on North Long 2023 fingerling stocking when that information is available.

Short-Term Rental Requirements

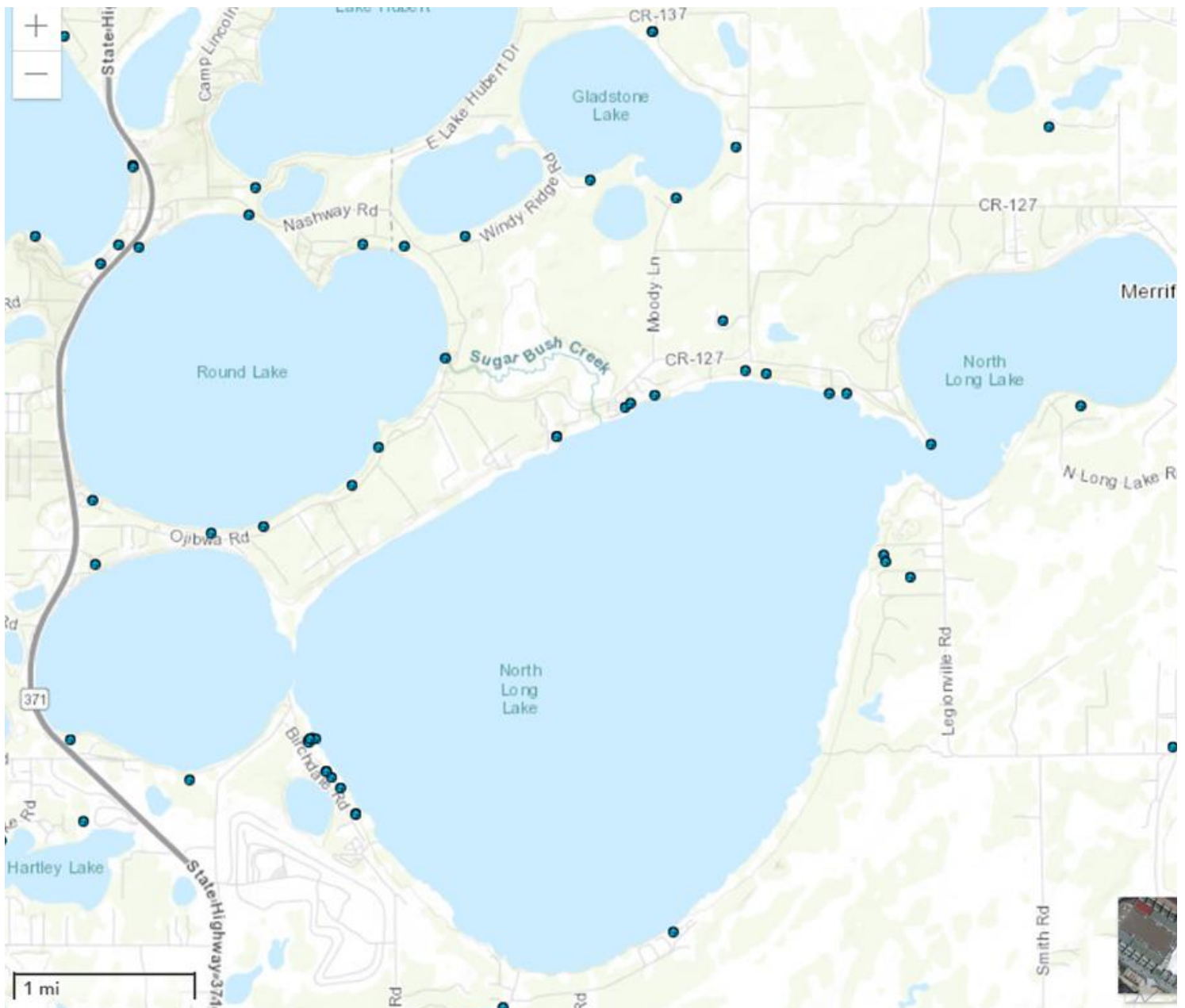
In response to inquiries and concerns that were raised by association members at the last annual meeting, the board has done some research on short-term rentals.

Starting January 3rd, 2023, all short-term rentals need to be registered with Crow Wing County and be licensed. The county ordinance has requirements for septic, occupancy, noise, parking, contact information and licensing.

Licenses are renewed annually and cost \$100 per advertised bedroom. There is a 24/7 hotline for complaints at 218-824-1132 or you can submit an online complaint form and attach photos.

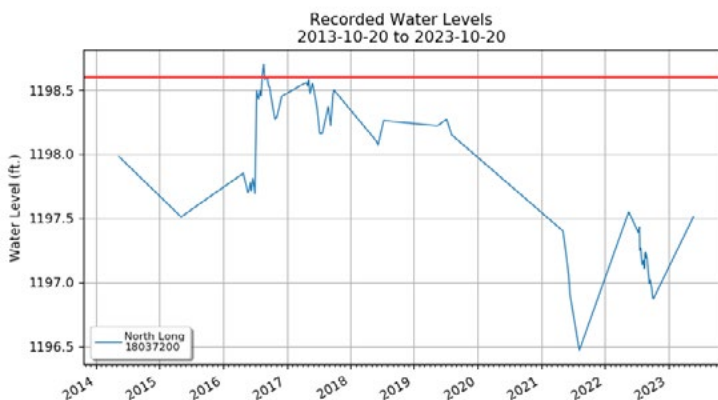

North Long Lake – Lake Level | By Alan Albrecht, NLLA Board Member

Unfortunately, in 2022 and 2023, we have seen a substantial drop in the level of the lake. Many of us have had to purchase addition dock, or move our docks further out, or in extreme cases position our lifts far from our docks. Some had to take their boats out early and some had difficulty getting their boats off of their lifts. With our shallow shoreline, a 6" drop in the lake level makes a very big difference.



According to various resources, from January 2023 to August 2023, Crow Wing County had five less inches of rain than we would expect to receive in a normal year. The same sources indicate that Crow Wing County is experiencing an extreme drought. Which raises the question of whether too much water is draining out of North Long, flowing through Sugarbush Creek, and entering Round Lake.

Jim Weiss walked the shores of Sugarbush Creek in September. At that point in time, there was no flow of water from North Long.



There was a dam in Sugarbush Creek many years ago. The details of this dam have been lost over time. This photo shows remnants of that original dam. We don't know if it was higher when first installed, but as you can see in this photo, taken from the road (County Road 127) toward the lake, it was not having any impact at that point in time.



In August of 2023, Jim Weiss and Alan Albrecht, spoke to Jacob Frie. He is the DNR Hydrologist assigned to Crow Wing County. We wanted to explore what could be done to maintain the lake level by impeding the flow of water from North Long into Sugarbush Creek.

In order to stop the flow of water out of the lake (i.e. a dam or closing off the culvert under County Road 127), a permit would need to be obtained from the DNR. As part of that permitting process, a study would need to be done to ascertain the encroachment, change or damage to the environment, and adverse effects on the physical or biological character of the waters. The change would have to be consistent with the established floodplain and established shoreland standards and ordinances. In essence, an environmental impact statement would have to be prepared. Ultimately, it would be up to the Commissioner of the DNR to either approve or disapprove of the permit. There is a process to dispute the conclusion of the commissioner. That would require commencing civil litigation against the DNR.

As stated by Jacob Frie, it is very unlikely that the DNR would ever approve the permit that we would need to control the amount of water coming out of NLL into Sugarbush Creek.

Kids Now Qualified to Captain a Boat

Who has the right of way on the water? What do those color buoys mean? How far must your boat be from other boats while underway? More than two dozen teens and tweens now know the answers to those questions thanks to your support of the North Long Lake Association. The NLLA sponsored a free Youth Boater Safety class in June at Dunmires on the Lake restaurant. The kids ranged in age from 12 to 17 and came from near and far to attend.

Members of the Crow Wing County Sheriff's Office Water Patrol division led the class through a series of scenarios, videos and quick quizzes for more than four hours. Several of the kids said they preferred to have the class in person rather than taking the DNR course online because it gave them the chance to ask questions, hear from the Deputies about real rescues and incidents, and - best of all - drive the Sheriff's Office water patrol boats through a course the Water Patrol laid out.

The classroom session was followed by a terrific lunch served by Dunmires, followed by a hands-on ride in the

Sheriff's Office boats. While class was in session, deputies had already placed buoys in the 371 Bay to create a navigation course once kids were in the captain's chair.

Each attendee also received a free lifejacket, courtesy of the North Long Lake Association. Watch this newsletter for announcements and details about next summer's course. The MN DNR's online course is always available at www.boaterexam.com/usa/minnesota/

2023 NLLA Annual Meeting and Picnic

Our annual meeting was held on Saturday July 15, 2023 at Legionville Camp.

We had 102 attendees representing 56 properties. Jim Weiss, NLLA Board President, opened the meeting at 10:00 AM. Sargent Brad Theising spoke to the group. He shared his personal work history and the various positions he has held prior to his current role which includes water activities, snowmobiling and ATV activities. He talked about the youth boating safety class which he teaches. He shared some rules and regulations around docks and boat lifts and finished with a reminder for everyone about how important it is to wear life jackets while boating.

Sarah Fogderud from AW Research Labs gave a presentation to the members about water sampling and water quality on North Long Lake. We sample our lake every month from May through September at 3 deepest spots in each area of the lake: 371 Bay, the main lake, and Merrifield Bay. Sarah shared that our lake is a Mesotrophic lake with good water quality. In summary, there are several things property owners can and should do to keep out lake's water quality high:

- Mow grass at 2.5 - 3.0 inches high
- Stop or reduce the use of fertilizer on lawns
- Grow a plant buffer zone at or near your shoreline
- Get your septic tank pumped and inspected every 3 years, more often depending on the number of people living at the residence.

Jim Weiss then proceeded with the 2023 Board Member election, calling for nominations from the floor. Three

incumbent members were re-elected (Jim Anderson, Mary McCormick and Jim Cook.), as well as a nominee from the floor – Becky Shawgo.

Jim reviewed our financial position – which is healthy - and our membership numbers. We have 427 members (from 593 properties on the lake) with 252 also contributing to the AIS fund. Jim then reviewed our communication methods including emails, Facebook, NLLA webpage, and the spring and fall newsletters put out in conjunction with the Round Lake Association.

The presentation continued with Jim sharing the activities the Lake Association is involved with each year including the Boat Parade on the 4th of July, sponsoring the Youth Boating Safety Class, moving the bog (150' x 50' this year), the Highway 371 litter pickup which is done in the spring and in the fall, and the NLLA logo clothing offerings which are ordered thru GLS supply.

Jim then spoke to our AIS efforts, including our Curly Leaf management specifically located in Merrifield Bay, our annual survey of lake vegetation, and our water testing. The survey this year showed not enough Curly Leaf to warrant spraying as per current DNR guidelines. We will continue to monitor and treat this as needed. The Board is discussing with the County how to accomplish more boat and trailer inspections at the boat landings.

There were 18 companies which donated one or more door prizes this year. Prizes were randomly awarded to the members present at the meeting. Our silent auction raised \$450 for our AIS Fund. We also selected eight winners for our Life-On-The-Lake photo contest.

The meeting adjourned at 11:20 and it was time for a picnic lunch. Brats, hot dogs, potato salad, beans and chips were served by volunteers. And once again, we had cookies and root beer floats for dessert. During this time, we presented our annual slide show for our Life-On-The-Lake photo contest and the 371 Bay Boat Parade.

NLLA New Board Member

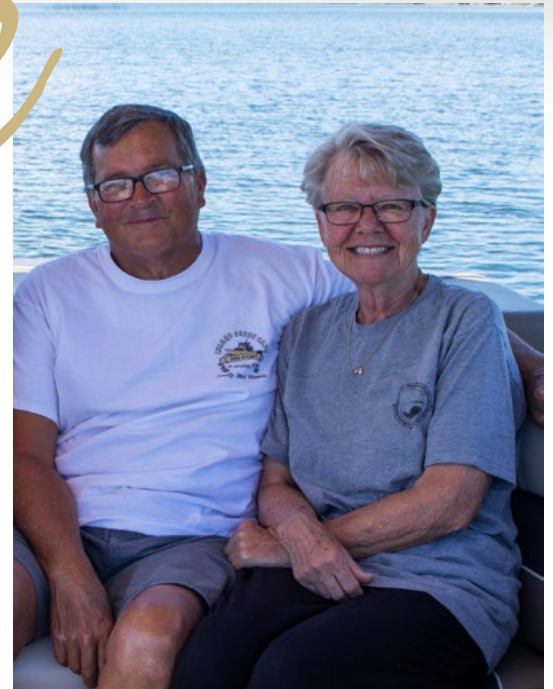
The North Long Lake Association has a new board member: Becky Shawgo. Becky and her husband Bob have been active members, helping out whenever help is needed.

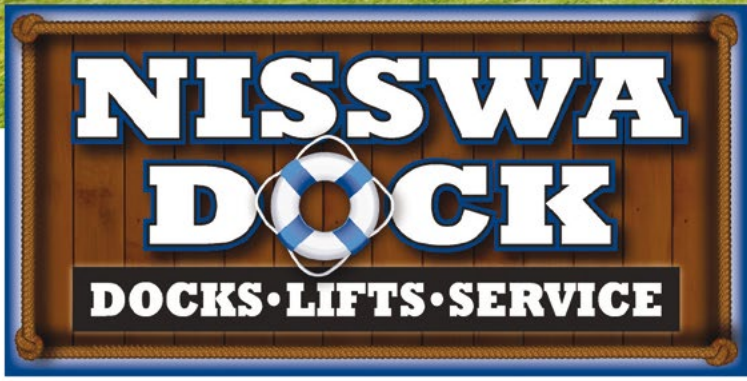
